"Because of dugout), for many years to come, many students who do not know Sam will be touched by him," she said.

Madison's crisis counselor Donna Lane said she noticed some students at other schools had a need for more school uniforms. Last year, Madison Academic seniors began donating school uniforms for a class project. The idea spawned this year into "Sam's Dugout," after Lane discussed the idea with school officials, a parents' organization and Sam's parents.

Sam's friend, Ben Carlton, designed the shelves for an Eagle Scout service project. The project was assembled over two Saturdays by the members of Boys Scouts Troops 12 and 115 along with other scouts from Madison.

Carlton said he thought the dugout would be a nice way to honor a friend who he knew well from school and from being members of the same Boy Scouts

The dugout is one example of the compassion of those involved with the school, said Lisa Carson, guidance counselor for Madison juniors and seniors.
